

#### Consent to construct an approach to a county maintained road is granted on these terms and condition:

- 1. The Contractor/Approach Owner must pay for all damage to the existing road caused by their activities.
- 2. The Contractor/Approach Owner is responsible for any and all claims of damage, personal injury, or bodily injury that might result from their activities in Bottineau County. Furthermore, the Contractor/Approach Owner agrees to indemnify and hold harmless Bottineau County for any and all claims of damage, either personal injury or property or any type of claim for damages of any nature whatsoever, whether valid or invalid, that is made against Bottineau County on account of the activities conducted by the contractor/Approach Owner.
- 3. The minimum road top width shall be 24 feet with adequate surfacing applies.
- 4. If required, a culvert sized adequately matches existing approaches.
- 5. A clear sight stopping distance for the posted speed limit shall be used as a minimum clear sight distance.
- 6. If the approach will be used by the general public (as a section line road) a run off on the opposite side will be required. Signing will be required as shown in the current version of the "Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices". The installation and maintenance of the signs are the responsibility of the Contractor/Approach owner.
- 7. Any intersection that may constitute a hazard shall require dangerous intersection or other warning signs. These signs may be required after the construction of the approach if it proves to be a hazard to the public.
- 8. The approach shall be constructed with good workmanship so as to leave a neat appearing project.
- 9. Once completed the entire disturbed area with the exception of the road top shall be covered with black dirt and seeded with an approved seed mix.
- 10. Any disturbed area within the right-of-way shall be rehabilitated and seeded using an approved seed mix.
- 11. Submit application once the county has approved approach site/location.

The Contractor/Approach Owner must comply with all terms and conditions stated herein. Failure to comply with this CONDITIONAL CONSENT shall cause the consent to be rescinded and the Contractor/Approach Owner must remove the approach from the right-of-way immediately or be responsible for the costs incurred by the County in removing the same. Bottineau County specifically reserves the right to remove the approach from right-of-way for non-compliance and reimbursement will be made to the County by the Contractor/Approach Owner for doing the same.
